Once we have an idea of how many kids who make the team(s) a coach will contact the parents of the team and discuss their schedule.

Practice will be at least once a week for one hour. This is separate from KYBL so please plan accordingly. KYBL practices are 7-8pm. Boys on Tuesday, Girls on Wednesday. Please see the KYBL flyer for that info.
