GRADE 1 C.H.A.M.P.S.

For Students in Grade 1

C.H.A.M.P.S. provides instruction to move students closer to grade level reading and beyond. Students will improve their phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. Students will develop strategies for self-monitoring and corrective reading to promote comprehension.

Daily creative writing will further develop students' love for writing while also working on grammar and mechanics within the writing process.

Math skills include: number operations, place value, time, shapes, measurement, word problems and fractions.

These skills will be reinforced while fostering a love for learning!



**GRADES 2 & 3
C.H.A.M.P.S.**

For Students in Grades 2 & 3

C.H.A.M.P.S. will provide instruction and review to enhance skills across the curriculum. Students will improve phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension skills as well as learn strategies for self-monitoring and corrective reading. Students will work on comprehension strategies with narrative and informational text.

Daily creative writing skills will be reinforced to expand students' writing while reinforcing grammar, mechanics, and editing during the writing process.

Math skills will include: place value, measurement, money, word problems, addition and subtraction problems as well as equations.

Students will build upon and grow in previously taught skills for a solid foundation for the upcoming school year.

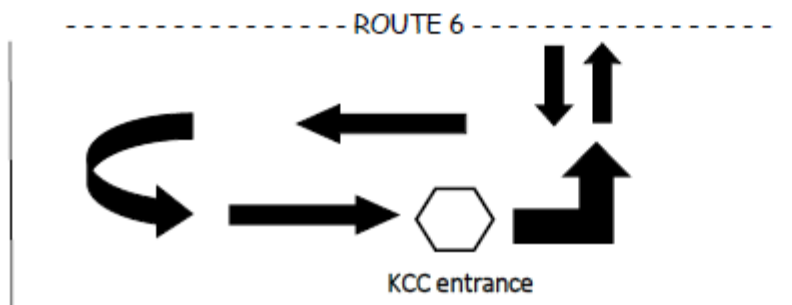


Daily Schedule

- Monday** 8:45-8:55 - Check-in, return waiver. Today is the only day parents escort their child in for drop-off. *LESSONS (italics)-introductions of staff, rules, crossing the street, stop signs, traffic lights, knowing your name, address, phone number, safety belts.*
- Pickup: 11:30-11:40 - children are escorted to your car each day, starting today. Parents *do not get out* of the vehicle. Children are put into the rear passenger seat by Safety Town personnel. Tape the sign with your child's name to the front, passenger side windshield.
- Tuesday** Drop-off: 8:50 - children are escorted *from your car* by Safety Town personnel. Please have child sitting in the rear passenger seat. *Stranger safety, good touch vs. bad touch, buckle up, and 9-1-1*
- Pickup: 11:30-11:40
- Wednesday** Drop-off: 8:50 - *Bus, playground, water safety, what to do when lost, animal safety, visit from a canine friend*; Chapin Forest Field Trip - Children are to be dropped off as usual, at 8:50. Complete homework and evaluation (return Thursday)
- Pickup: 11:30 at Chapin Forest Hobart Road-Park and sign your child out at the pavilion.
- Thursday** Drop-off: 8:50 - *Fire and gun safety*; Kirtland Fire Department visits. Morning drop-off is the same.
- Pickup: 11:30 - Park and sign your child out at the entrance.
- TOUR: 11:30 - Parents and family tour Safety Town. Do not get into the car pickup line. Park, walk in, and meet your child for a tour prior to graduation.
- GRADUATION: 12:00 - Community Center pavilion. Bring lawn chairs. Picnic to follow. Bring a finger food to share.
- Children will take their folder home on Thursday. It contains all of their lessons, songs, and handouts.*

Proceed into KCC and turn right. Wind along outermost parking lot perimeter, towards the front door. Safety Town staff will help your child in and out of the car at the front entrance. Have your child in the rear passenger seat for ease in and out of the car.

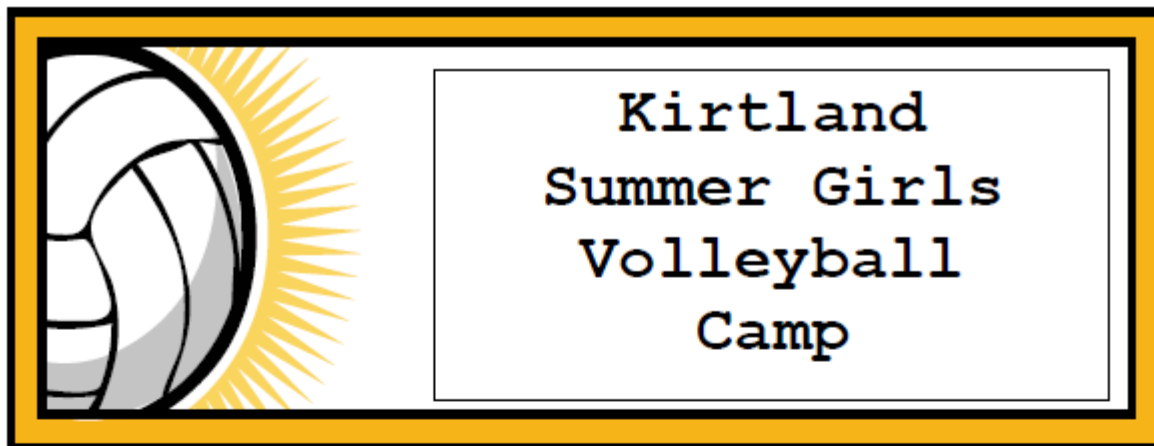

Instruction continues to be based on the State of Ohio Preschool Standards and Curriculum, but we have also aligned the program with Kindergarten expectations, which promotes success as our preschool students make the transition. Our preschool staff led by Heather Miller, certified in Early Childhood Education, works with our Kindergarten staff as well as area Preschool teachers to enhance instruction and programming.

In addition to our continuous effort to improve instruction and school readiness, we also reviewed district expenditures to preserve the quality education and services provided to all students in the Kirtland Local School District.

As staffing and supply costs increase to continue offering updated materials and services, the district plans to increase Kirtland Preschool tuition for the 2018-2019 school year. To remain fiscally prudent and in line with the price of other local preschools, while providing excellent instruction, the cost of next year's preschool tuition will increase to \$170 per month, or \$1,630 annually. A \$100 non-refundable deposit will be required to secure your child's placement in the Kirtland Schools' preschool program.

Our goal is to meet the needs of our Kirtland families while following the Ohio Department of Education's Preschool regulations, which impact class size and student/teacher ratios. While we remain fiscally prudent, administration will monitor preschool enrollment for the 2018-2019 school year. Preschool enrollment will determine class offerings; families will be notified by June 15, 2018, if there are any changes in classes.

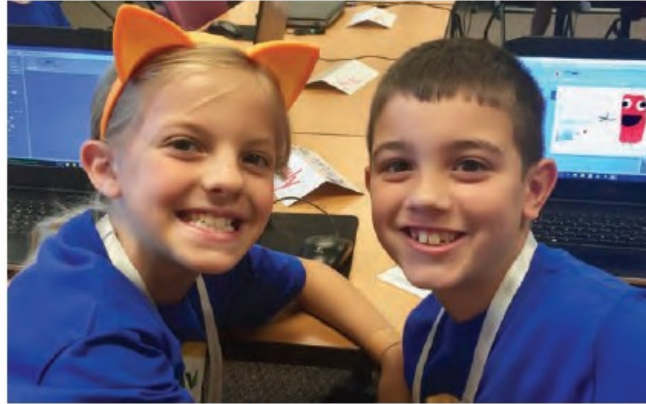
