Graduation Requirements

- The Program of Studies is on the KHS Website
 - Core class requirements (14)
 - 4 Eng., 4 Math, 3 S.S. & 3 Sci.
 - Elective Requirements (7)
 - Health (0.5) + PE or Waiver (0.5)
 - Service Requirements (16 hours...start now)
 - Junior Internship
 - End-of-Course Exams (18 points)
 - 7 tests: Alg. I, Geom., Eng. 9 & 10, Biology, U.S. History and U.S. Gov.

Physical Education Waiver

- P.E is not required to graduate from KHS if you complete the Waiver
 - Must take an additional elective in its place to earn the 0.5 credit
 - Must participate in 2 full seasons of an interscholastic sport, Cheerleading, or Marching Band over the 4 year span of high school

The 7-Period Day (7 + Lunch)

- School starts at 7:30 AM; ends at 2:37 PM
- The building is unlocked at 7:10 AM (Breakfast and Coffee Bar are NEW this year!)
- This gives you 20 minutes upon entering to go to your locker and get to first period
- Exit the building directly after school unless with a teacher, coach or advisor
- Classes are 50 mins. long (82 mins. on W/Th)
- Lunch & REC Periods are 40 minutes
 - You will have 20 minutes to eat and 20 minutes for REC (it is important to attend Lunch & REC in the designated order for seating purposes)

Tech Prep Program REQUIREMENTS:

- ✓ All 9th & 10th grade core classes completed
- Junior class standing (at least 10 credits completed)
- 2.0 GPA minimum for Tech Prep programs
- ✓ Good attendance/tardiness record
- ✓ Good counselor recommendation

National Honor Society (NHS)

- Scholarship 3.75 Cumulative GPA
- Community Service 40 hours, keep track separately from the 16 hours required for graduation
- Leadership assume 2 leadership roles (sponsor verified)

NHS Continued....

- Character model behavior in and outside of class
- Essay based on the pillars of NHS (service, scholarship, leadership and character)
- 2 letters of recommendation
- Participate in at last 2 school-related activities

HOW TO CALCULATE GPA

*Beginning with the Class of 2020 and beyond, <u>KHS will no longer report Class Rank</u>. There will be <u>no Valedictorian or Salutatorian recognition</u>, but rather students with Highest Honors, High Honors and Honors will be recognized at graduation. See "Class Rank" presentation on the KHS page for more details.

GPA* = Quality Points divided by credits

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    A = 4 quality points Honors +.5 (A=4.5) AP courses +1 (A=5)
    B = 3 " (B=3.5) (B=4)
    C = 2 " (C=2.5) (C=3)
    D = 1 " (D=1)
    F = 0 " "
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*Add quality points and divide by the number of credits

(Regarding courses/grades, the Official Transcript displays course name and FINAL GRADES ONLY)
