# Notes from Room 100

It has been a busy year in the music room where K-5 students have been heavily involved in performing, creating and experiencing all aspect of music. Using our on-line Quaver music curriculum, the students have studied the components of melody, harmony, pitch, rhythm, form, and style using song, dance and instruments. Currently, grades **K and 1** are preparing for their April 27<sup>th</sup> concert which is a salute to the American Folk song. We are combining literacy with our preparation as each song has a corresponding story book that we are reading as we learn the music. Everyone should be prepared to sing along!

**Second grade** is busy studying the musical language, the signs and symbols musicians use to read and perform. We took a journey back over 1000 years to learn about Guido de Arezzo who invented our system of note reading. We have been learning where the musical pitches fall on the staff and have used Boomwackers to perform melodies where the students must read the pitches to perform the song.

**Third graders** are very excited to be learning to play the recorder for the first time. This is a great opportunity for students to begin to synthesis the elements of music and learn what it is like to be a performer. To motivate home practice and hard work in the classroom, we are using Recorder Karate which allows students to test off songs learned in class and earn "belts". Lots of squeaks in the beginning but we are making progress.

**Fourth grade** is revisiting the recorder and finishing the second year of Recorder Karate. We are also reviewing the time periods of music dating back to Medieval times (800 -1450) to Modern era (1910-present). Our focus though, will be on the Romantic Period (1820-1910), a time of great emotion in music, and one of its greatest composers, Beethoven, who is celebrating his 250<sup>th</sup> birthday this year.

The fifth-grade band just performed their first concert after months of preparation. All the hard work and practice is really paying off! Finally, our **general music class** has had the unique opportunity to perform as a Handbell Choir this year. The school was fortunate to acquire a set of bells this summer and we were very excited to put them to use. The students have become independent musicians, having to read the music to perform their part!

All in all, a great year of music making in Room 100!






