Willoughby Stingers Swim Team – 2019

The Willoughby Stingers are a recreational swim team with an emphasis on providing a fun and safe summer activity for swimmers of all levels of experience and developing each swimmer's ability to swim all four stokes (free, back, butterfly, breast), The Stingers compete in the Suburban Swim League, or SSL, mostly against other Lake County teams. Many Stingers are also year-round competitive swimmers with the Lake Count West End YMCA Wildcats and area USA Swimming Teams. Some Stinger swimmers also use the swim team as a fun way to keep in condition for other competitive sports, such as soccer, basketball, and volleyball.

All children between the ages of 6 and 18 (as of June 1) are eligible to join the Willoughby Stingers Swim Team. Children 6-8 years old must be able to swim a minimum of one (1) length of the pool unassisted, children 9-18 years old must be able to swim a minimum of two (2) lengths of the pool unassisted. Unassisted includes without floating devices.

Team practices are Monday-Friday mornings at the Euclid Avenue pool as well as Tuesday and Thursday nights at the Osborne pool on Lake Shore Blvd. Swim meets with surrounding communities will typically be on Saturday mornings, with a possibility of one or more Friday night meets.

Stingers registration fee is \$80 per swimmer with a family maximum of \$200 through June 1st. After June 1st until June 8th the cost will be \$100 per swimmer. You will receive a Stingers team t-shirt and a swim cap with your registration. There is no guarantee for a team t-shirt to members who join after June 1st. Registration deadline is June 8th. Payment: Cash, personal checks & credit cards will all be accepted during walk-in registration. Only credit cards will be accepted online.

On-line registration is available through June 1, 2019. Login at www.stingerswim.com to enroll. Additional late fees will be charged when registering from June 2- June 8. There will also be a walk-in registration on Saturday, May 18, 2019, from 9:00-11:30 am in City Hall at the Parks & Recreation Department. At that time, you will be able to look/purchase team swim suits, spirit wear and purchase your season pool pass. Please bring a photo ID and a current utility bill with your name and address on it.

All swim team members must also have a Willoughby Pool Pass. They can be purchased at the Parks & Recreation Department from 7:30 am - 4:30 pm (or until 6:00 pm Monday through Thursday, May 9-June 1). If you do not have a pool pass by June 4, 2019, you will not be eligible to practice or swim with the Stingers swim team until a pool pass is purchased.

They're An alarming number of young people are using vape pens/Juuls. Studies show that most believe vaping does no harm, and don't give much thought to what's in these products. Here are the facts:

- Vape pens/Juuls deliver high levels of nicotine; they're extremely addictive. Plus, vaping liquids contain other toxic chemicals that have been linked to cancer, respiratory disease, and heart disease.
- · Although vaping is illegal in Ohio for those under 18, teens can easily find ways to buy the products online. Also, e-cigarettes cost less than traditional cigarettes.
- Vape cartridges come in kid-friendly flavors. They often look like flash drives, and are easy to hide.
- These devices are also sometimes used to vaporize THC, the chemical responsible for most of marijuana's mind-altering effects. Vaping THC eliminates the telltale smell that occurs when marijuana is smoked. Thus, someone can use marijuana without being detected.
- Black market cartridges some containing illicit drugs far stronger and more dangerous than nicotine or THC are becoming more common. Area law enforcement has confiscated cartridges containing cocaine and hallucinogens. Vapers might not know what they're ingesting. That's extremely dangerous.

TALKING WITH KIDS ABOUT VAPING

- . It's never too early to begin the conversation, but make sure you're doing so in an age-appropriate manner.
- Educate yourself first.
- Approach the topic with caring and curiosity, not judgment. Ask what they've heard about vaping and what their peers think about it. This offers an opening to replace myths and hear-say with facts.
- If a teen admits to vaping, getting angry won't help. Teens need to know that parents are there for them even when they make unwise choices.
- . Be a role model; walk the talk. Teens will have a hard time believing that vaping is dangerous if they see adults doing it.
