

Dear Honors 9th Grade ELA Students,

Summer is great time to relax with a good book. In addition to being a source of entertainment, reading for at least 30 minutes a day boosts your ability to learn, to think creatively, to focus, and to communicate. Therefore, over the summer, please read a <u>minimum</u> of **two age appropriate books. Select titles that appeal to you!** Use this opportunity to explore a new series, author, or genre. Talk with family and friends, browse the Kirtland Library, or visit a local bookstore for suggestions.

As you read, complete a total of <u>six</u> WordMaps (attached) to explore unfamiliar vocabulary. Please reference the model to ensure accurate completion. If you *do not* encounter new vocabulary words, consider selecting a more challenging text.

In addition to the six WordMaps, please keep a **Response Journal**. This journal is designed to encourage *original* thought and *individual* responses. It can be typed or handwritten and should include:

- <u>Reactions and Connections</u>: Share some of your personal reactions and connections.
 Minimum Requirement: 10 reactions and/or connections <u>per book</u> that span the length of the text. Write in complete sentences.
- <u>Significant Lines</u>: Select striking or thought-provoking lines from the text. Be ready to explain why you feel the words are noteworthy. Minimum Requirement: Select 5 lines <u>per book</u>. Write the line and page number.
- <u>Visualize</u>: Create symbols, sketches, pictures, cartoons, charts, diagrams, timelines, etc. This representation should help you understand an aspect of your text or express information in a creative way. *Don't underestimate the power of stick figures! Minimum Requirement: 3 visualizations <u>per book</u>.

During the first week of school, I'll collect your WordMaps and Response Journal. We will also utilize them in class, so please be prepared to share your work. Happy reading!
